From the Composer

The catalyst for this anthem comes from words discovered by an Allied soldier towards the end of World War II. They are believed to have been written by a young girl, whose name we shall never know, who died in a Nazi concentration camp. On the wall of the cell she occupied until her death she wrote the following:

I believe in the sun even when it is not shining.
I believe in love even when I cannot feel it.
I believe in God even when He is silent.

Like the author of these words, each of us have had moments when life has not played out the way we had scripted it in our mind; when it has felt like God was silent in our time of greatest need.

The gospel of Mark records an incident where a man brought his son to Jesus asking Him to heal the boy of some challenging and frightening health issues. The father, in his struggling faith, pleaded for Jesus to have mercy and to bring healing. Jesus assured him that everything was possible for those who believed. The father's response were words each of us have recited in one form or another when our confidence has been severely shaken: "I believe. Help my unbelief."

A plea to God for strength to be lieve, for hope in an overwhelming situation, for a glimpse of light in the midst of a dark night...these are sentiments we all share and have experienced. But our Creator invites us to come with honesty and transparency, and to lay our burdens at the feet of the One who promises to be our strength in times of need. And in so doing, we find the courage to carry on. This is the assurance that is ours as children of the living God.
