About the song:

Often thought to be an American folk song due to its popularization in our country by professional folk singers in the sixties, I know where I'm goin' is an Irish country song coming from the northeastern county of Antrim. (Belfast is found in this county.)

The text is sometimes Americanized with the word Lord substituted for dear in the phrase And dear knows who I'll marry. In Ireland, dear knows is the Ulster equivalent of goodness knows.
