They landed on Mount Ararat, so high and dry.



Jonah! Turn around!



(The Prophets)


Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi, who are these guys, and what's their story?

and still he prayed; three times a day he knelt down on his knees.


Oh, now Daniel has been thrown into the lions' den!

(Moses, Pharaoh, and the Plagues)


Tell me, what will it take, oh, Pharaoh?
