When our three children were still living at home and students in our local public school system, we would annually receive the standard policy statement about school cancellations related to weather. I always found these to be intriguing commentaries about life in Minnesota, particularly during the winter months. Here is an excerpt from one such document:

Extreme wind-chill can be very dangerous.
