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Foreword

Organists are consistently grateful to David Lasky for his decades of useful contributions to the repertoire of American church musicians. David's music is always written with the practical needs of the church organist in mind, and his numerous volumes of published compositions have become a staple of the library of many service players.

This volume is a sequel to *Expressions* (70/2245L), a collection of original pieces and settings of general hymns. For that collection, we asked David for a grouping of easy organ pieces (even easier than usual) particularly suited for anybody for whom practice time is extremely limited. This volume, *Seasonal Expressions*, continues the same basic concept but is organized around the church year. The book begins with Advent and continues through Thanksgiving/Harvest, with each season represented by several pieces, mostly based on familiar hymns/carols. Several original pieces are provided that can be flexibly used at any time when the mood is suitable.

The overall result is a terrific collection of varied material with both the signature Lasky sound and with easy manual and pedal parts. This music is well-suited to beginning and early intermediate organists. More advanced players will find material that is sight-readable for quick use in worship.
