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Foreword

Five Occasional Voluntaries (2018) can be played with the hands alone but use of the pedal (coupler only) facilitates some spots. The individual colors of the organ (Flutes, Strings, Principals, Reeds) can be demonstrated with the suggested registrations but the individual pieces can sound just as well with other registrations. These pieces were premiered by the composer at St. Mary's, Tuttlingen (Germany), on July 2, 2018.

The remaining pieces are conceived for organs with at least two manuals and pedal. They all can be used equally effectively in concert or service settings. If all five were played together in concert, the order of the notes below could suggest an order for the pieces. In this case, the title *Five Voluntaries for Festive Occasions* could also be used.

A Processional Voluntary in G (2018) opens majestically with a *Grand jeu* registration (Foundations with Reeds and Tierces) on all manuals. It is dedicated to my friend and colleague Rudolf Hendel (Albstadt, Germany) upon the occasion of his retirement.

The Peace of God (2010) is a meditation on the Scripture text from the letter of St. Paul to the Philippians 4:7—"And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." It is a quiet voluntary in a traditional ABA form.

Introspection was commissioned in 2009 by Dr. Artis Wodehouse of New York for a concert harmonium, the Mason & Hamlin "Liszt" Reed Organ. It lends itself perfectly well to being played on the pipe organ, and some suggestions for registration are in the score. The form is rather free, like a fantasia or rhapsody.

Clothe Yourself With Compassion (2009) is also a meditation on a scripture text from the Letter of St. Paul to the Colossians 3:12—"As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." The basic 5/4 meter and changing meters give it an unsettled, restless mood. The skeletal melodic and harmonic material is austere, resulting in an almost minimalistic impression.

The **Fanfare Voluntary** (2015) was written at the request of my good friend Dr. Jürgen Buchner of Wurzburg, Germany, for use at commencement ceremonies at the University of Wurzburg. It is most effective on organs that have a Tuba or Fanfare Trumpet stop. It was premiered by the composer at St. Mary's in Tuttlingen on December 31, 2016.
